

REVIEW – Perth City Summit Workshop Outputs

21 August 2017

Overview

The Perth City Summit was convened by John Carey MLA, the Member for Perth. It was held on 19 August 2017 with 350 attendees and was the final community consultation in a process commenced earlier in the year.

At the Summit 35 recommendations were reviewed, tested and prioritised. Below is an analysis of Committee for Perth’s research and advocacy positions against a number of the recommendations.
